Lord God, bestow upon your Church the Holy Spirit. Just as your Spirit arrived with a driving force on that first Pentecost, may your faithful be energized and renewed so that with intense faith, they might spread your fiery love. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Lord, the Giver of Life

Today's readings: Acts 2:1–11; Psalm 104:1, 24, 29–30, 31, 34; Galatians 5:16–25 or 1 Corinthians 12:3b–7, 12–13; John:19–23 or John 15:26–27, 16:12–15. Today we rejoice in the sending of the Holy Spirit to the world. As proclaimed in the Gospel of John, Jesus had promised to send "the Advocate . . . the Spirit of truth." When the Spirit arrived, Acts records, it was with a driving wind that filled the house where the disciples were and appeared as tongues of fire.

From that house, the disciples went into Jerusalem fearless as they preached the Gospel in numerous languages they had never before spoken. In the years that followed the descent of the Holy Spirit, the disciples were persecuted, arrested, and stoned. Still, they kept their hearts focused on bringing Christ to others. Christians receive the Holy Spirit during the sacrament of baptism, as the celebrant prays that God bestows "new life" by "water and the Holy Spirit." The Spirit will assist the baptized throughout life to fulfill their responsibility as "members of Christ, Priest, Prophet and King," as the presider says in the anointing after baptism.

In your prayer life, be attentive to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and you, too, could be fearless in witnessing to the light of Christ in your life. As we recite in the Nicene Creed, the Holy Spirit is "the Lord, the giver of life." When you open yourself to the Spirit, your life can be transformed And just as the tranformation of the disciples changed lives, so will your transformation.

RESPECT LIFE

Understanding Conscience - God creates us with a natural desire to seek His truth and love Him. It is the conscience inside each one of us. Our consciences help us hear His voice and recognize how we ought to live and hence may live in a way that leads to true happiness. We all have the personal responsibility to align our consciences with the truth so that our consciences can properly guide us in dealing with the daily life challenges. It is similar to using a language: if we are not properly educated in its vocabulary and grammar, we will communicate poorly, and others will not understand us. Likewise, we aren't well-equipped to determine right from wrong, if our consciences aren't well-formed; and we may choose an action that is, in itself, wrong even though we have the best of intentions. The following are a few suggestions on how to strengthen our consciences with God's truth so we may understand a little more how to live rightfully and happily.

1. *Pray*—in drawing closer to the living God, through prayer and participation in the sacraments, especially Confession and the Eucharist, we allow God's grace to conform our minds and hearts to Christ, and we might better discern in every moment how we ought to act. 2. Learn-learning about Christian moral principles, reading the Catechism of the Catholic Church, or researching what the Church says about a challenging teaching will help us grow in knowledge of the truth, and our consciences gain a foundational, practical formation to guide us well in concrete situations. 3. Reflectimmersing ourselves in the stories of holy women and men can encourage us and help us develop habits of mind that allow us to grow. 4. Nurture Friendships—we gain partners who can lighten the load when we devote energy to holy friendships with people who are also trying to know, love, and serve the Lord.

PLANTING SEEDS- PART V by Roberta Cheong

St. Paul said, "I planted, Apollos watered, but God caused the growth. Therefore, neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who causes the growth... For we are God's co-workers" (1 Corinthians 3:6-7, 9a). Evangelization is a collaboration with the Holy Spirit. We are teammates with God. Therefore, we must pray for us to be filled with the Holy Spirit and for the Holy Spirit to work through us, especially before we go out to evangelize, even if we're proclaiming the gospel to only one person. Because without God, we can do nothing. Only the Holy Spirit can convert souls. If we do not pray, all of our evangelization efforts will be in vain. For only the Holy Spirit can make the seeds we plant in people grow.

Prayer is a crucial component of evangelization. We pray for a person's conversion, salvation, and sanctification; that they believe and come to know the truth that is Jesus Christ. We pray that God sends people to us who need to hear that Jesus loves them, died for them in order to save them, and rose from the dead. We pray that God sends the Holy Spirit into the people we meet and that He opens their hearts and minds to Him. We pray that the Holy Spirit speaks and works through us, as He did through the very first Apostles. One thing we can do, if the person we are evangelizing is willing, is to pray with them. The entire process of making disciples is enveloped in nonstop prayer for the person's soul, because only the Holy Spirit can grant someone the gift of faith.

St. Monica persistently prayed for the conversion of her husband and her son for a prolonged number of years (some sources say for 30 years!). Both of them later converted and even became saints in the Church. Her husband became St. Patricius and her son became the famous and beloved St. Augustine.

Let us reflect now on our own lives and ask ourselves these questions: Am I Jesus' disciple? If yes, then how was I made into a disciple of Jesus? Who planted the initial seeds of faith in me, and how did they do it? Who proclaimed the gospel of Jesus Christ to me? What impact did hearing the Good News have on me? Who taught me about Jesus, His teachings, His commandments, and how? Who helped me grow in my faith, and how did they do it? How did I learn to pray and recognize God's voice? What was it like when I first heard the voice of the Holy Spirit speak to me? Who gave me my first Bible? My first rosary? My first *Catechism of the Catholic Church?* How did I first encounter the person of Jesus, and how did we become friends? How did I come to know what Jesus is like? How did I grow to love Jesus? How did I realize that God and the Holy Spirit is real, alive, and active in my life? How did I learn to recognize the presence, the power, and the work of the Holy Spirit within me and my life? Do I remember "the moment I believed" and what that was like? Did someone invite me to church? What was my first experience at Mass like? What was it like when I received my first Eucharist? How did I feel after the first time I went to Confession? How did following the Lord change me and my ways? How did my godparents, family, friends, priest, etc. help me grow closer to God? Who shared their personal testimony with me? Who were good role models to me on how to live as a missionary disciple of Jesus, and why were they good models? Who were my spiritual mentors? Who inspired me to love God more and to follow Him more intimately, and how did they do it? How did I realize that I need Jesus in my life for everything? How did I realize that God loves me unconditionally? How did I mature as a disciple of Jesus? How did I go from being a tiny seed to a tree that produces good fruits? How did I continue learning about Catholicism

to develop a deeper understanding of God? How did I learn to live according to God's ways vs. the ways of the world? Why did I remain a disciple? How did I remain a disciple in the midst of challenges or persecution?

By recalling, "How did God make *me* into His disciple?," we can come up with plenty of ideas on how we can evangelize others. Jesus said, "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another" (John 13:34b). So by reflecting on the way God loved us into communion with Him, that is how we can also love other people into communion with God. In addition, for most people, the answers to these questions writes the beginning of their conversion story—their personal testimony—which is one of the most powerful tools we can use to evangelize when shared with others.

Let us go and plant the seeds of faith that were once planted in us!

BENSON AND HIS MOTHER By Fr. John Cuff

One bright Sunday morning Benson's mother hurries into her son's bedroom to wake him. "Benson, it's Sunday, time to get up and go to church! Get up, sleepyhead!" Benson mumbles from under the covers, "I don't want to go." "What do you mean you don't want to go?" says his mother. "That's silly. Now get up and get dressed and go to church!" Benson says, "No, I don't want to go and I'll give you two reasons why I don't want to go." He props himself up on the bed and continues, "First, I don't like them, and second, they don't like me." His mother replies, "Now, Benson, that's just plain nonsense. That's silly. You've got to go and I'll give you two reasons why you must. First, you're forty years old now, and secondly, you're the pastor!"

Sleepyhead Benson could very well be any of the Apostles in today's Gospel whom Jesus had commissioned to be His witnesses in Jerusalem, in Judea, in Samaria and to the ends of the earth. But as soon as He leaves them, they retire to the upper room and hide. They were afraid of the Jews. Like Benson, the Apostles knew that the people didn't like them, and that their message was different from the popular message of the time, and so they just wanted to wrap themselves up in bed, roll over, and not have to go and face the hostile crowd.

We Catholics are a bit like that. We go to church quietly, receive Jesus in our hearts quietly, and go home again quietly to say our morning and evening prayers quietly. But what about the command Jesus gave us last week to be His witnesses and share the Good News of God's love with all mankind? Plus the gifts of the Holy Spirit He gave us to do so? Yes, people often don't want to hear about God. We're afraid they're going to tell us off if we speak to them about faith. We're afraid they won't listen to us, or call us religious freaks. They don't like us and we don't like them. And so, like Benson, we give up on our God-given mission to be witnesses and go back to bed and curl back up into our nice comfort zone.

Fortunately, Pastor Benson has a guide, his mother, who wakes him and coaxes him to go out and do his duty. This is the kind of work that the Holy Spirit does in the hearts of believers. When fear of trouble tends to paralyze us into silent submission, afraid to speak out, the Holy Spirit is the adrenalin of the Mystical Body of Christ that warms us up and empowers us to go out there and make a difference. He (or She) reminds us, as Benson's mother reminded him, that we have a mission, to tell our friends and relatives the Good News of God's love and that they are invited to the OCIA to learn more about Him. So today on Pentecost, let us pray, "Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and enkindle in us the fire of your divine love!"
