Corpus Christi

As we celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, I hope the following words of wisdom from Pope Francis can nourish us.

Jesus was broken; he is broken for us. And he asks us to give ourselves, to break ourselves, as it were, for others. This "breaking bread" became the icon, the sign for recognizing Christ and Christians. (Homily on May 26, 2016)

The Eucharist gives us a grateful memory, because it makes us see that we are the Father's children, whom he loves and nourishes. It gives us a free memory, because Jesus' love and forgiveness heal the wounds of the past, soothe our remembrance of wrongs experienced and inflicted. It gives us a patient memory, because amid all our troubles we know that the Spirit of Jesus remains in us. (Homily on June 18, 2017)

Today is the day to ask, "... Do I, who have so often been fed by the Body of Jesus, make any effort to relive the hunger of the poor?" Let us not remain in different. Let us not line in a one-way faith, a faith that accepts the gift but not give it in return. Having received mercy, let us now become merciful. For if love is only about us, faith becomes arid, barren and sentimental. Without others, faith becomes disembodied. (Homily on April 11, 2021)

Each time we receive th Bread of Life, Jesus comes to give new meaning to our fragilities. He reminds us that in his eyes we are more precious than we think. He tells us that he is pleased if we share our fragilities with him. He repeats to us that his mercy is not afraid of our miseries. The mercy of Jesus is not afraid of our miseries. And above all he heals us from those fragilities that we cannot heal on our own, with love. (Angelus on June6, 2021)

May the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ continue to nourish us, forgive us, reconcile us, and form us into who and whose we are called to be.



THE WOUNDED SOLDIER-BOY By Fr. John Cuff

In introducing the Eucharist to His followers, Christ told them the "hard saying" that "My flesh is real food and My blood real drink," and that unless we eat His flesh and drink His blood we will not have life within us. How to understand this "hard saying"? Perhaps a story may help.

A young soldier was seriously wounded on the battlefield and brought back to the field hospital; although out of danger after a few days, he would not eat. The nuns and nurses tried everything to get him to eat, but he adamantly refused all food. Finally they wrote to his family that their son refused to eat and was going to die. Soon the boy's father arrived. Though glad to see him, the young soldier soon reverted to his refusal to eat; he had lost the will to live. Finally, as his despondent father prepared to leave, he said to his son, "Oh, I almost forgot, here's some bread your mother made." Suddenly the young man opened his eyes, propped himself up and said, "Bread baked by Mom? Oh yes, give me some, please!" Soon the young soldier was on his way to recovery.

The boy in this story represents all of us, for we too have been wounded in the battle of life by sin, selfishness, trials and troubles of daily life. We've so many material things that bombard and satisfy our appetites, and as a result we've lost our taste for spiritual food that can strengthen our souls. Then we hear Christ say, "I am the Bread of life come down from heaven, the bread sent by my heavenly Father to give life to the world." Just as the father in the story told his son, "Here's bread your mother made," so the priest at Mass holds up the sacred host before us and says in so many words, "Here's Bread your heavenly Father made."

In the story of the dying boy there was nothing really magical about the mother's bread; it contained no secret ingredient that made the boy get well. But perhaps there was a very important ingredient; it was made with love. The boy ate the bread and got well because it contained his mother's love for him. In the same way the Eucharist is also made with love, when Jesus died and offered Himself because he loves us. Moreover, it is Bread from our spiritual home in heaven, sent by our heavenly Father, to give us divine life and spiritual healing. And, reflecting on Pope Francis's oft-quoted image of the Church as a "field hospital" for treating the sick and the wounded, we can also better appreciate his recent comment that "The Eucharist is not a prize for the perfect, but a powerful medicine and encouragement for the weak." Now that the Covid restrictions on attending Mass are no more, we can again personally receive this Heavenly Food. Let us not refuse to eat.


