Sunday, May 5, 2024 Joy and Love



Today's readings: Acts 10:25–26, 34–35, 44–48; Psalm 98:1, 2–3, 3–4; 1 John 4:7–10; John 15:9–17. The Gospel provides a sense of the immensity of God's love in the first sentences today. "As the Father loves me, so I also love you," Jesus tells the disciples. Imagine what that means. Jesus is saying that he loves his followers with the same love that the Father loves him. From these few words, we can begin to understand the communion of love to which we are invited through our baptism.

In the first reading, it becomes apparent that God reaches out to all to share his bountiful love. "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality," Peter explains, citing his rea-

son for meeting with the Gentile Cornelius. Peter well knew that it was unlawful for a Jew to visit a Gentile; however, Jesus had shown him another way. No one was to be considered profane or unclean. As he ministered to the Gentiles, Peter became a living testimony of God's love.

The reading from the First Letter of John explains that we are to love one another because "love is of God." As followers of Christ, we are to spread what is God's. The author of the letter notes that, by loving, we come to know God. Consider who you refrain from loving. Read over today's Scriptures several times this week to deepen your understanding that "God shows no partiality."

THIS WEEK AT HOME

Monday, May 6 Take Your Place

Jesus predicts a dark future for his followers when he says, "They will expel you from the synagogues; in fact, the hour is coming when everyone who kills you will think he is offering worship to God." Preceding that reading is a psalm of thanksgiving, directing that we remember that we belong to God. "We are his people, the flock he shepherds," the psalm proclaims. Dispositions of trust and gratitude may have allowed Lydia, the dealer of cloth in Acts, to open her heart to preaching, seek baptism, and invite the disciples into her home. *Today's readings: Acts 16:11–15; Psalm 149:1b–2*, 3–4, 5–6a, 9b; John 15:26—16:4a.

Tuesday, May 7 Ready Your Hearts

It is not surprising that the disciples grieve upon hearing that Jesus is leaving them. After all, they had spent years with Jesus, witnessing his preaching and healing. Since they had not yet experienced the Spirit, it might have been little comfort when Jesus explained, "For if I do not go, the Advocate will not come to you." The Gospel today refers to the Spirit as the Advocate, and in the Nicene Creed, the Spirit is called "the Lord, the giver of life." How does the Holy Spirit instill life in the Church? *Today's readings: Acts 16:22–34; Psalm 138:1–2ab, 2cde–3, 7c–8; John 16:5–11.*

Wednesday, May 8 Go into the World

St. Paul and the other disciples acted as a Church on mission, traveling to spread the Good News. In today's reading from Acts, St. Paul tells the Athenians that God "gives life and breath and everything." As St. Paul preaches, he yields to the Spirit, who Jesus says in the Gospel will "guide you to all truth." This Easter Time pray to the Holy Spirit for guidance. *Today's readings: Acts 17:15, 22—18:1; Psalm 148:1–2, 11–12, 13, 14; John 16:12–15.*

Thursday, May 9

Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter

"You will grieve but your grief will turn to joy," Jesus tells the disciples before ascending to be with the Father. The disciples had no idea of what lay ahead so, of course, they were grieving the anticipated loss of their teacher. Can you imagine their joy when they discover that, as followers of Christ, they had a new life in Christ that demanded that they spread the Good News? *Today's readings: Acts 18:1–8; Psalm 98:1*, 2–3ab, 3cd–4; John 16:16–20.

Ascension of the Lord

In today's Gospel, we hear of God's yearning for all to be saved. Each baptized person has the same mission as the first disciples to proclaim the Gospel. Have you considered that doing so is part of your baptismal responsibility? *Acts 1:1–11; Psalm 47:2–3, 6–7, 8–9; Ephesians 1:17–23; Mark 16:15–20.*

Friday, May 10 Focus on the Joy

Jesus likens the pain and suffering of the disciples to that of a woman in labor. Once the child is born, joy erases the pain. As the disciples anticipate Jesus' departure, they are in pain; however, when they meet the Lord again, their joy will be eternal. As we hear today, no one will take that joy from them. *Today's readings: Acts 18:9–18; Psalm 47:2–3, 4–5, 6–7; John 16:20–23.*

Saturday, May 11 For Your Joy to Be Complete

"Ask and you will receive, so that your joy may be complete," Jesus tells the disciples. Usually, people request things that they think will bring them happiness, and sometimes only fleeting happiness. But Jesus points out that what the Father gives will bring joy. How has God been present during the joys in your life? What does it mean for your joy to be complete? *Today's reading: Acts 18:23–28; Psalm 47:2–3, 8–9, 10; John 16:23b–28.*





SERVANT OR FRIEND By Fr. John Cuff

A man once declared war on his pastor because he let people receive Communion in the hand standing, rather than on the tongue kneeling. "They deny the real presence," the man protested, "If they knew that they're actually receiving Christ, they'd kneel to receive!" In reply, the pastor asked him, "What would you do if Jesus suddenly appeared to you?" "Why, I'd immediately fall on my knees and adore," the man replied. "But there are people who'd simply throw themselves on Him out of sheer joy and love for Him," the pastor said, "Would you say such people are irreverent?" The man calmed down as he began to see that it's probably less a question of the right way to encounter Christ present in the Eucharist and more a question of one's personal relationship with Him.

Today's Gospel gives us two models of personal relationship with Jesus: as a servant (in Greek doulos means "slave") or as a friend. At any given point in our faith journey one of these two models is predominant. Either we see our relationship to Christ mainly in terms of masterservant or in terms of friend-friend. Excepting mystics, traditional lay spirituality in the Church has followed the master-servant model. Jesus is seen more as a master to be feared, respected, and obeyed, than as a friend to love in intimacy and familiarity. Today's Gospel challenges us to rethink our relationship with Jesus since evidently, Jesus Himself prefers to relate with his disciples as friend to friend rather than as master to servant: "I do not call you servants any longer, because a servant doesn't know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends" (John 15:15). When Jesus says that He no longer calls his disciples servants, this seems to indicate that He's called them servants until then. Thus our relationship with Christ goes through different stages. First it starts off as a master-servant relationship when we're new to the faith, but then as our relationship with Him deepens, it changes into a less formal friend-friend type of relationship. Why then do so many of us stick to the masterservant way of relating to Him as if it were the only way? Today's Gospel calls us to move beyond the infant stage. the servant-master relationship, and enter into the adult stage, the friend-friend way of relating to Him. This changes the way we pray and the way we live. We begin to pray better and experience more peace and joy into our lives, as people do who are in love.

How to tell the difference between irreverence and disrespect shown by those who have no serious relationship with the Lord, and the true familiarity which grows out of a loving relationship with Him? The key is to keep His commandments. Yes, God loves and accepts us as we are, but He loves us too much to leave us as we are. We love babies as they are, yet we want them to grow up. Similarly, God expects us to grow in His love. True love for God is shown in deed by the way we keep the twin commandments of love of God and neighbor. By this we can know if we're truly Christ's friends, because He tells us, "You are my friends [only] if you do what I command you."

RESPECT LIFE

Be Not Afraid (USCCB Article) - When battered by life's storms, or immersed in a dense fog of suffering and uncertainty, we may feel alone and unequipped to handle the circumstances. Yet with words that echo through thousands of years into the corners of our hearts, the Lord says to us, "Do not fear: I am with you" (Isaiah 41:10). He speaks these words not as one who merely observes our pain, but as one who experienced immense suffering. And the very wounds that bear witness to his suffering indicate the essence of our identity and worth: we are loved by God. Reflecting on the healed wounds of the Risen Christ, we see that even our most difficult trials can be the place where God manifests his victory. He makes all things beautiful. He makes all things new. He is always with us. Jesus promised this when he gave the disciples the same mission he gives to each of us: Go. Go be my hands and feet to a world enslaved by fear. Go to the woman who is unexpectedly pregnant and fears the future. Go to your friend who fears reprisal at work because he takes a stand for the protection of human life. Go to your aging parent in failing health who fears being a burden. And go to others, too, for their support. We don't need to have everything figured out. We can simply follow the guidance of Our Blessed Mother, the first disciple: "Do whatever he tells you" (John 2:5). Walk with each other. Do not be afraid to embrace God's gift of life.
