From the Desk of Fr. Francis

Greetings of Christ's Peace and Joy! Hope you all had a blessed week.

Come to the Feast

Today's readings remind us that God is the host of the banquet we all are invited to be part of and God provides for all people for their hunger. These rich images certainly bring us a lot of comfort and hope as well as questions and challenges.

It is comforting to know that God invites all to the banquet. Sometimes we come to the celebration well-prepared; other times, we may not be as prepared as we should; and still other times we use our freedom to refuse God's invitation.

This image of God providing for all can be also challenging to us, especially at times of natural disasters and suffering. When hundreds of people are victimized by hurricanes, earthquakes, and gun violence, we question God. When innocent people suffer from unbearable illness, we question God. How does God provide to innocent victims? Certainly there are different responses. What is your response?

I think the question at issue is not solely about God, but our human freedom. God gives us the freedom to say yes or no to justice, mercy, compassion and life. When we choose ignorance or violence, God's banquet will be left with empty seats. When we choose not to wear the proper wedding garments, it is not God the host who refuses us, but actually we ourselves have chosen to be left outside.

As human beings, we are fundamentally destined to God by our nature. As St. Augustine succinctly tells us that we are restless until we rest in God. So even though we may not understand God's will at times of suffering, but our faith tells us that our God is always with us and provides for all.

Like the King in the Gospel story, God has new a new invitation to all. Unlike the King, who grew angry at people's refusal of his invitation and people's bad behaviors, God always has compassion and God constantly offers us new invitations.

What is God inviting you to do now? Are you free to respond? God's invitation is always free, but there is a cost to our proper response---repentance.

This reminds me of a recent conversation I had with a young man. He told me that he is interested in joining our Mandarin RCIA, but he is busy on Sundays. He has to work on weekends. Our schedule doesn't fit into his schedule. I asked him if there is any possibility that he can go to work an hour later. He simply responded by saying that he doesn't want to lose his job.

I totally understand this young man's fear of losing his job. His job also made him not free to begin a journey to inquire more about faith and God. Sometimes we too are burdened with things in life that render us not free to respond to God's invitations, things, such as sin, addictions, anger, and other unhealthy habits.

Your presence at Mass today says that you have accepted God's invitation. Are you doing your best to cooperate with God's invitations in your life?



"Put On the Wedding Garment" ~Sister Caritas

When we are in school and are participating in a team activity, a captain for each team may be chosen. Then the captain chooses the team members. Some children are always chosen right away. Others stand in line wondering and hoping someone will pick them for their team. Then there are the last few who get a place kind of by default. It is a very difficult position to be in over and over. Eventually it may encourage someone to not participate at all. Sometimes it can also be like that in Church groups.

This is not how God acts toward us. He invites all people at one time of their life or another, to come to "The Wedding Feast". We are all invited to be part of the celebration of the oneness of Jesus with His Church, the Body of Christ. We, the members, are Jesus visibility here on earth. We are called and chosen by God through the Sacrament of Baptism. Why were you and I chosen and not some other people? Perhaps they were not able to hear the invitation. Perhaps they had not been open to the invitation or no one asked them to come and join the Body of Jesus, the Church. Perhaps they were not ready. Maybe like the people in the Gospel, they had excuses for why they could not come.

Each Sunday and Holy day we are invited by Jesus, by God, to come to the Wedding Feast. We are called to wear our "Wedding garment", the life given to us through baptism and the other sacraments. We are called to come and celebrate and be actively a part of the Body of Christ. When you think about coming to Church on Sunday, think about it as coming to a worship celebration. Think about it as a time to come together and rejoice in the death and resurrection of Jesus. Come together to be nourished by the Eucharist and give thanks for that blessing and all the other graces and gifts God gives us. Reach out and invite others to come to the celebration of the wedding feast. Invite others to be baptized and put on the "Wedding garment" and come to Jesus' celebration. WE celebrate the invitation. We celebrate God's welcome. We celebrate His Word. We celebrate His sacred Body and Blood and we celebrate the support, love and joy of being together in the family of God. We celebrate we are CHOSEN by God.


