Meditating on the Stations of the Cross

As we quickly approach Passion Sunday, this period time of Lent especially remind us of Jesus' suffering for us. We know suffering well, and our World is filled with it. Christians also know the meaning of suffering. As Roberta Cheong shared two weeks ago, there is redemptive value in our suffering if we willingly embrace our daily cross. **"If you really want to love Jesus, first learn to suffer, because suffering teaches you to love,"** wrote St. Gemma Galgani. Indeed, love and suffering are inseparable.

One of the ways I found helpful for me to make sense of our suffering is through praying the Stations of the Cross. This devotional prayer usually takes place during Lent. It has many lessons to teach us about suffering, love, transformation and hope for eternal life. If you haven't been able to pray the Stations of the Cross this Lent, I invite you to join us next Friday and Passion Sunday with the Living Stations led by our School children at 12:30pm. Meditating on the Stations of the Cross can help us to connect life's sufferings with Christ's and make the necessary changes in our life.

Initial Scenario A: 3 parishes

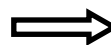

- Parish 3: Nativity of Our Lord and St. Gabriel would unite to form one new canonical parish. Bridgeport Catholic Academy and St. Gabriel School would serve the new parish as the new parish evaluates the sustainability of continuing both schools. The parish would need to support any operating deficits driven by low enrollment.

Initial Scenario B: 4 parishes

- Parish 1: St. Therese Chinese Catholic Church, All Saints – St. Anthony, and Santa Lucia would unite to form one new canonical parish. Santa Lucia Church would close for worship. St. Therese Chinese Catholic School would serve as the parish school and continue to explore expansion to an additional campus. Santa Lucia School would close for the 2019-20 school year.
- Parish 2: St. Barbara and St. Mary of Perpetual Help would unite to form one new canonical parish.
- Parish 3: St. Jerome Croatian would continue in its current canonical structure.
- Parishes 2 and 3 would collectively support 1 school located at either St. Barbara or St. Jerome.
- Parish 4: Nativity of Our Lord and St. Gabriel would unite to form one new canonical parish. Bridgeport Catholic Academy and St. Gabriel School would serve the new parish as the new parish evaluates the sustainability of continuing both schools. The parish would need to support any operating deficits driven by low enrollment.

Initial Scenario C: 2 parishes

- Parish 1: St. Therese Chinese Catholic Church, All Saints – St. Anthony, Santa Lucia, St. Barbara, St. Mary of Perpetual Help, Nativity of Our Lord, and St. Gabriel would all unite to form one new canonical parish. All Saints – St. Anthony and Santa Lucia Churches would close for worship.
- Parish 2: St. Jerome Croatian Parish would continue in its current canonical structure and focus on serving as a center of Croatian Catholic culture.
- St. Therese Chinese Catholic School would continue to explore expansion to an additional campus.
- St. Barbara School would serve as the school for the northern part of Bridgeport. St. Jerome and Santa Lucia Schools would close for the 2019-20 school year.
- Bridgeport Catholic Academy would serve as the school for the southern part of Bridgeport and Canaryville. St. Gabriel School would close for the 2019-20 school year.

"DEATH and NEW LIFE" ~Sister Caritas

When it gets a little warmer, we will see the farmers out preparing their fields. Next they will begin to plant the seeds. The machinery makes straight rows and the seeds are put into the ground and covered with the earth. When you go by the fields at that time, you do not see anything but the good earth. Everything is in the process of being transformed even though we do not see it. Within the seed is the new life that will grow into the plant which will produce the food or fruit.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells us, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat, but if it dies, it produces much fruit." He uses the image of the wheat to talk about Himself. If He does not suffer and die nothing will change. We will not have a way to reach heaven. The fruit of His death and rising is the gift of grace and the chance to enter into the Kingdom of God in heaven as well as be the Church here on earth.

Often we work very hard at praying, doing good, trying to change. We do not see any progress. In fact it can seem like there is no life, no change. After a time, in God's good time, there is a radical change. There are new possibilities and new life. There are more results than we ever dreamed. Nothing is impossible. The seed bears much fruit.
