The Transfiguration of the Lord

Below is a short excerpt from Father Greg Friedman's explanation of this Sunday's Gospel. I hope it will help you to understand the Gospel better.

Religious composer Marty Haugen has a musical collection called *The Song of Mark*, which features stories from that Gospel. One song, called "So Good to Be Here," is a delightful number that has the three disciples present at the Transfiguration on the mountaintop with Jesus, singing how nice it is to be with Jesus on the mountain of Tabor, where all their troubles seem so far away.

Peter, as we hear in the Gospel read in church this Sunday, wants to set up camp on the mountaintop. You get the impression he'd be happy staying right there. I suspect we all sometimes share that sentiment. The good feelings we may get from the Sunday Mass or a great retreat experience tempt us to stay put, to bask in the glow of the transfigured light of Jesus.

But there's a real world out there. The problems and obstacles to the Good News confront us there. With Christ, as composer Marty Haugen reminds us in his gospel song, we must go back down the mountain--to suffer, die, and rise to new life .



From Styrofoam to Paper



If we, as a parish, are unified in believing that we should stop using styrofoam products as one way to care for our environment and for our health, what alternatives can you think of to replace it? Bamboo products, sugarcane products, reusable products, foil products, 100% post-consumer waste recycled paper products, and some corn-based plastics are all envi-

ronmentally-safe options.[1] One reasonable option is for us to switch to **paper** cups, plates, soup bowls, and take-out containers for our regular weekly hospitality usage as well as for special celebrations and events, including the Summer Fair, Lunar New Year, Easter, and Thanksgiving celebrations. It is also important to note that we should try to use the same plate, bowl, or cup for refills instead of getting a new one each time we get seconds or thirds. Next week, we will publish research we have done contrasting the prices of styrofoam and paper products in various stores and see how practical it would be to actually switch to paper products.

Recruiting for the RCIA

Last week icebreaker questions were provided as a way for parish members as they live out their call to be missionary disciples in our RCIA program.

This week two practical suggestions are shared for RCIA recruitment.

First, when you think about your audience for the RCIA, remember that it is not just for those who have not been initiated into the faith. The RCIA is good for those who have fallen away from the Church, have not been going to mass for some time, or simply want to brush up on the basic tenants of their faith. The RCIA program is a good way for any Catholic to re-engage their faith in a personal way.

The classes, while very basic in terms of their content, are extremely rich in terms of their context. Each person is treated as a unique "child of God." As a result, the questions each person brings to the table are of critical importance to the on-going dialogue in the class. The more diverse the group the better the class.

Second, as we celebrate the feast of the Transfiguration today, it is important to remind ourselves of how important it is for each Catholic to stay close to Christ, especially in the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Word, prior reaching out to others. When the transfigured Christ is alive within us, we are then able to radiate Jesus' transforming love to others.

"SATISFY US O LORD"

Many places in the United States during this summer have been dealing with extreme heat. Many places in the West have over one hundred degree temperatures. In these kinds of temperatures water is essential. One can become very thirsty. Water is really the best thing when you are experiencing thirst.

Today's First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah invites us to satisfy our thirst. We are called to come, without paying, and be fed and satisfied. If we stop long enough and reflect, deep within us is a thirst for God. It is a thirst that can only be satisfied by God and a relationship with God. We have a deep longing for God who created us and redeemed. God is our final destination. St. Augustine tells us "our hearts are restless until they rest in you, O God." Sometimes we think that having lots of money will satisfy us. We try to have a "good time" and in that way deaden or satisfy ourselves. We try even to run away, or to pay no attention to God and the longing we have for God. None of these things changes this thirst or makes it go away. God wants us to be close to Him. He gives us this desire. In the poem, "The Hound of Heaven", Francis Thompson, who lived in the late 1800s, describes a journey which addresses this relentless desire for God and God's continuing desire for us.

Our Gospel today shows Jesus feeding the hungry people with bread and fish. Our first reading talks of coming to have our thirst satisfied and the second reading by St. Paul reminds us that nothing can separate us from the love of God and His love for us. If we choose to follow Jesus and choose to stay close to God we will eventually find all that we want and need. God will never leave us. It's all up to **each of us**.
